**SUBJECT:** Application for Residential Parking Areas

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**BACKGROUND:**

The City received an application to establish a Residential Parking Zone in the neighborhood adjacent to the new Esther Simplot Park, which is located at 3206 W. Pleasanton Ave, Boise, ID 83702. The application included all of the proper neighborhood approvals, as well as supporting documentation for the request.

The Parking Services Office began neighborhood outreach by planning and publicizing a public neighborhood meeting. A legal ad ran in the Idaho Statesman on July 12, 2017, and staff placed flyers on vehicles parked within the affected area on July 18 and 20, 2017.

The public meeting was held on July 25, 2017, at the central pavilion located within Esther Simplot Park, to receive feedback from those individuals affected by the requested Residential Parking Zone. Based on the public comments and concerns regarding the proposed Residential Parking Zone, staff recommends establishing the zone to cover the area from the west side of Whitewater Park Boulevard to the east side of 29th Street, between the south side of Madison Avenue and the north side of Woodlawn Avenue, inclusive of all street segments within that range.

**FINANCIAL IMPACT:**

This project has a total estimated cost of \$22,000, to be spent out of the Parking Services budget.

**A RESOLUTION CREATING A NEW RESIDENTIAL PARKING ZONE PURSUANT TO BOISE CITY CODE SECTION 10-11-19 TO INCLUDE THE AREA FROM N. WHITEWATER PARK BLVD. TO 29TH ST. AND FROM MADISON AVE. TO WOODLAWN AVE.; PROVIDING FOR A PARKING BY RESIDENTIAL PERMIT AND A ONE-HOUR TIME LIMIT FOR NON-RESIDENTS; DIRECTING THE PLACEMENT OF SIGNS BY BOISE CITY PARKING SERVICES; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.**

**WHEREAS**, the City of Boise, through its Parking Services Office, has received a request from area residents requesting the establishment of a Residential Parking Zone to include the area from the west side of Whitewater Park Boulevard to the east side of 29th Street, between the south side of Madison Avenue and the north side of Woodlawn Avenue; and

**WHEREAS**, the Boise City Parking Services Office announced a public hearing on this matter through printed notices distributed on July 18 and 20, 2017, in the affected neighborhood, and a legal advertisement placed in the Idaho Statesman on July 12, 2017, and such public hearing was held on July 25, 2017, thus providing notification as required by Boise City Code Section 10-11-19(B); and

**WHEREAS**, the Boise City Parking Services Office considered all of the feedback provided at the public meeting held July 25, 2017, and based on that feedback recommends approval of this request and implementation of the Residential Parking Zones and this parking permit program be ratified by the Mayor and City Council.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BOISE CITY, IDAHO:**

**Section 1.** The recommendation of the Boise City Parking Services Office is hereby ratified and ordered that a Residential Parking Zone be created for the area from west side of Whitewater Park Boulevard to the east side of 29th Street, between the south side of Madison Avenue and the north side of Woodlawn Avenue.

**Section 2.** The Residential Parking Zone shall be designated a one-hour parking time zone for all non-residents.

**Section 3.** The Boise City Parking Services Office is hereby directed to place the appropriate signage in the designated area.

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**Section 4.** This Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its adoption and approval.
